

CHOREOGRAPHERS

Gwynne Bilski, a Canadian choreographer and multi-disciplinary artist based in Scotland, explores memory and lived experience through performance, installation, and various artistic mediums. Raised on the traditional territory of the Lheidli T'enneh in Northern BC, her work delves into personal geography, using the body to redefine our connection with surroundings. Integrating her background in visual arts, creative writing, and dance, Gwynne's creations meld contemporary movement, literary, and conceptual art practices.



In her eleven years abroad, **Giselle Liu** has made significant contributions to the dance world, ranging from community-based projects to commercial and contemporary works. She danced in the Dance On Series 'Puzzle' by Flora Hon and Kelvin Lam, toured with cantopop star Fiona Sit, and choreographed for beauty pageants. Returning to Canada, she collaborated with various artists and continues to share her passion for art's beauty, creativity, and empowerment.





Melissa McCracken, an emerging choreographer hailing from Prince George, British Columbia, received her professional dance training at The Ailey School and Peridance Capezio Center in NYC. Her recent works include Trembling Shelf and Undark, an experimental dance film showcased in international festivals. Certified in Simonson Technique, Melissa is also a guest choreographer and workshop facilitator for Method Dance Society.



Cai Glover honed his craft as a performer and choreographer with Cas Public from 2012 to 2022. He contributed to 8 creations for the company, showcasing his innovative approach. Recently, he founded "A Fichu Turning," exploring the intersection of poetry and movement. As a hard of hearing artist, hearing differently has become a driving force of his artistry and originality as a mover, interpreter and choreographer.

Amber Downie-Back (she/they) is an interdisciplinary movement artist based on the unceded territory of the lak wənən Peoples. Collaborating with sound artist Angus Gaffney, Amber integrates dance with sound and video art, exploring transformative experiences in physical and digital spaces. With a BFA in Contemporary Dance, Amber challenges boundaries, investigating the interplay between process, product, performer, and audience. Their work has been showcased at prestigious venues like Festival TransAmeriques and Toronto Harbourfront Centre, reflecting Amber's innovative and boundarypushing approach to art.



Anya Saugstad, Vancouver-based dancer and choreographer, explores movement and storytelling on traditional lands of Skwxwú7mesh', Stó:lō, and xwməθkwəyəm First Nations. Trained at ArtsUmbrella and SFU, she tours globally with works like "Ocean Roaring" and "Flora Fauna," addressing climate crises through raw, femme-centric performances. Recognized with the Iris Garland Emerging Choreographer Award, Anya collaborates with emerging artists, fostering site-specific works, advocating for environmental consciousness and accessibility in performance art.

The fantastic and the mundane collide as on stage, the dancers work through the ebb and flow of discovering their own realities.
